- Our police service, West Hennepin Public Safety, is a joint powers agreement between Independence and Maple Plain. They provide 24/7 protection and do an Maas-Kusske incredible job of "community policing" and building relationships. We are part of the West Metro Drug Task Force made of local area police departments, including our partners at the Hennepin County Sheriff's office.
 - Party in the Park, hosted by the Orono Rotary and the City of Maple Plain, raises funds for various organizations and park improvements.
- The West Hennepin Chamber of Commerce is made up of an affiliation of neighboring cities working together to support businesses and encouraging people to shop local.
- The Maple Plain Fire Department is another example of a successful JPA. The partnerships they have with neighboring fire departments are invaluable.
- The association we have with the Delano Senior Center allows our senior citizens to have other opportunities with fellow senior citizens to share a meal together, go on day trips, receive medical services, and so much more. They recently purchased a van (more about that can be seen later in this newsletter!). This van will be used to pick up Maple Plain residents and bring them to the senior center a couple of times a month if transportation is a barrier. The Delano Senior Center is also a place for those that are fifty-five years old or older to take driver's safety classes and to file taxes.
- The alliance with the Orono School District allows us to have the shared playground on the east side of the Discovery Center, to host various events, and to offer community programs in our parks. It is also home to our current city hall!
- Planning Commissioners, EDA Commissioners, election judges, and elected officials are a great example of collaboration between staff, consultants, business owners, and neighbors.
- The Paul Stinson American Legion Post 514 and the American Legion Auxiliary store equipment at the Maple Plain Fire Department, meet at city hall, and serve veterans in and around our city.
- WeCAN has a mobile office in the Discovery Center. WeCAN delivers food throughout our community via the mobile market and does so much for our community and the surrounding communities.

These are just a few of the ways that I can think of that truly exemplify that together, we are better!

One of my favorite quotes is from Helen Keller; "Alone we can do little. Together we can do so much!" I encourage each of you to think of one way that together we can make a positive difference in someone's life, our community, and the world.

Focus on a Firefighter - Generational Community Fire Service

On Sunday, June 18th as we celebrated Father's Day, the city wishes to celebrate the fathers that make up Maple Plain Fire Department. These men are not only our local heroes, but they are also fathers, coaches, employees, and leaders in other organizations.

Maple Plain Fire Department has a long tradition of generational fire service since its beginning in 1930, 93 years ago. Current Firefighters Cory Schultz, Lt. Zach Christianson, and Chief Brad Couser are part of their family's multi-generational service to the Maple Plain communities. An extension to this list is two sets of father-son firefighters that are currently serving together. Our current father-son duos have over 113 years of combined service to our communities.

Fire Fighter Chris Doyle has two sons, Joe and Brian, serving with him on the fire department. Chris joined the fire department in 1997 and has served in many roles including Captain, Asst. Chief, and Chief. Brian joined the department in 2014 and Joe in 2020. Joe served on the Montrose Fire Department for five years before moving to Independence and joining MPFD. Chris commented "It is rewarding to serve with my sons on the fire department. Serving our communities side by side is so awesome and I am so blessed to serve and watch my sons serve."

The second father-son duo is Ray McCoy and his sons Justin and Jay. Ray joined the fire department in 1977 and has served in many roles over the years including Asst. Chief, MPFD Relief Asst. President, Trustee, and is currently serving as Fire Chief for the second time. Justin joined the department in 2009 and Jay in 2012. Ray commented "It is a privilege and honor to serve our citizens and communities with my sons. Seeing the passion that they have for service is humbling."

City Administrator Update

We warmly welcomed Shirley Slater-Schulte as our interim City Administrator in late April and she has been working hard to continue assisting Maple Plain. Make sure to introduce yourself and welcome her to our great community! She brings a wealth of knowledge and experience and we are fortunate to have her leading our staff and consultants during this transition.

The City Council made a very important decision on April 10, 2023 to work with David Drown Associates (DDA) to begin the process of hiring a new city administrator. We have received twenty-one applications. DDA has narrowed that down to ten applicants that will be moving forward in the process. The council will be meeting at the end of June to review and discuss those ten applicants and decide who will be considered as finalists. Interviews will take place during the week of July 17th. The best candidate for our City will be selected on July 19th and an offer will be extended shortly after that. The new city administrator will likely begin serving in this role by mid to late August.

Rainbow Park Receives Nine New Trees!

The City of Maple Plain hosted a Volunteer Tree Planting event in Rainbow Park on May 20, 2023. This event was part of the Preparing for Emerald Ash Borer Grant that the City received in 2022. The Preparing for Emerald Ash Borer grant allowed the City to remove nine diseased/dead ash trees from Rainbow Park and Veterans Memorial Park, but it also enabled the City to purchase eighteen new trees to replenish our community!

Fourteen volunteers braved the heat and came together to plant nine new trees in Rainbow Park. An additional nine trees will be planted in Veterans Memorial Park in the Summer of 2023. A community tree inventory and tree management plan were also created as a part of this grant and will assist the City with continuing to grow its tree canopy in the future.

It is important to remember to always report the occurrence of these instances (obstructed roads, downed powerlines, etc.). While these incidents may not seem like emergencies, they still have the potential to impact the lives of all those in our community.

Residential Best Management Practices - Lawn Care Tips from the City Engineer

Maintaining a healthy lawn provides great environmental benefits. Healthy lawns can help prevent soil erosion, protect our watershed from water runoff, and even inhibit weeds and other pests. Choose best management practices to improve the health of your lawn and protect the water!


- Mow high (3-4" tall). Taller grass promotes deep roots, aids water and nutrient retention, and shades out weeds.
- Mow regularly. This will reduce the need to collect clipping. It is best to cut less than 1/3 of the grass blade at any mowing to reduce plant stress and recovery.
- Leave grass clippings on lawn. Clippings less than 1 inch long may be left on the lawn. They are a valuable source of nutrients for your lawn.
- Take a soil test to know what nutrients your lawn needs and to help select the right fertilizer for your lawn. Excess nutrients will wash off landscapes and pollute surface waters.
- Apply fertilizers and herbicides according to the label (It is the law!) and when they will be most effective.
- Sweep up grass clippings and other materials from hard surfaces to prevent stormwater pollution.
- Regularly check irrigation systems to make sure they are positioned correctly and watering according to your lawn needs. This will prevent stormwater pollution and help conserve our precious water resource.

Street Seal Coating - 2023 Project

The City will be completing maintenance on approximately 4 miles of local streets in 2023. The Maple Plain City Council awarded the 2023 project in March and property owners in the affected neighborhoods will be receiving notice accordingly by a flyer left in their door regarding the schedule.

Seal coating protects the roadways from the deteriorating effects of the environment. The seal coat helps extend the useful life of the pavement by providing a waterproof membrane to slow down the reduction of oils in the asphalt and keeps moisture out of the street.

Residents can expect some delays during the day that the process is completed. No parking notices will be placed along affected streets the day before work begins. Specifically, do not water the boulevard (to keep the street dry) and do not drive on the black tack material until the rock chips have been placed on top. The City thanks you for your understanding and patience!



Step To It 2023 - Maple Plain "High-Steppers"

This year, Maple Plain has 6 "Step to It" participants. Maple Plain's highest stepper was Steven Sturman with an astounding 830,139 steps! Our community participants walked a total of 2,225,339 steps between May 1 - May 28th!
